Casey would like to study architecture, and now realises, that sustained hard work is necessary to achieve the grades he will require. His school results continue to improve, he appears more settled in school,

Hearts of stone - a challenge

26,575 children die each year, usually due to things that can be prevented but are caused by the poverty they live in. 26,575 is a statistic, which takes away their stories, personalities and cheapens the value of each child, created in the image of God. (Richard Sterns, World Vision).

This we experienced in the death of a young girl called Kadi Paola. Kadi was a bright young fifteen year old who was unfortunate to be born with the HIV virus. She had many problems with her health but through it all she studied hard and her dream was to become a teacher, sadly Kadi never lived to fulfil this dream. We found out she was in hospital whilst

visiting another family, the hospital is not the best of places and due to the lack of medication in Choluteca we had to send by bus to Tegucigalpa for the things she needed, however the TB she had contracted really took a hold, Ian was there with her throughout her last moments. Kadi had accepted Christ around two weeks before her death, Ian had the privilege to be able to pray with her minutes before her death and she seemed to find peace in God. The death of Kadi impacted us all, we have had many death's only last week (5th Nov) we had another but Kadi was different we all found it hard to distance ourselves from the situation before her death.
